**4. Public Question Time**: There was one member of the public present.

Mr. V. Tye expressed concerns about the proliferation of new advertising signs on the fron of the new Londis shop and the large number of refrigeration units on the side of the building and requested the Parish Council to write to Wiltshire Council Enforcement Officer and the Conservation Officer.

## 7. Matters Arising:

a. Enforcement matters:

Quarry Woods: Letter received stating that the landowner had appeared in the High Court and had stated that they wished to appeal the LPA's application for an injunction. The Judge ordered them to submit their grounds of appeal and evidence to the LPA within 7 days and for the LPA to send the defendant of their rebuttal within 7 days from then. A second hearing will take place in not less than two months to consider both parties positions and to determine the matter.

Condensing Units – Londis: It was reported that the Enforcement Officer had visited the site and was considering both the condensing units and the signage.
